## THE STUDY OF EPHESIANS LESSON 2 QUESTIONS EPHESIANS 1:3-6

It may be said that the doctrine of election is one of the most contested and debated in the history of the church. Our passage today is critical to the discussion of election. Begin your study with prayer. Pray for the Holy Spirit to reveal truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson. "But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth" (John 16:13).

1. "Blessed be" denotes that Paul is offering praise to God for the spiritual blessings listed in the verses to follow (vs.4-14). The blessings are anchored "in Christ"—in his person and work in salvation—and "in the heavenly places." List the spiritual blessings "in" and "through" Christ mentioned in 1:4–6.
2. Take each <i>spiritual blessing</i> phrase that you wrote above; define and/or explain what each means. Take some time on each phrase, study it, pray about it, take it apart, consider each word and reflect on it, praise the Lord for these spiritual blessings! You can use any of the verses provided for help, or find some on your own, as well as look up the definition of any word you would like more clarification on. For example; What does <i>chose</i> ( <i>eklego in Greek</i> ) mean? What is the definition of <i>predestined</i> ? <i>Adoption as sons</i> ? Etc Matt. 25:34; John 17:24; 2 Tim. 1 9; Col. 1:22; Eph. 5:27; Rom. 8:15; Rom. 8:28-30; Job 14:5; Phil. 2:13; 2 Thess. 1:11-12; Isaiah 43:21.

Take each spiritual blessing phrase that you wrote above; define and/or explain what each means. Take some time on each phrase, study it, pray about it, take it apart, consider each word and reflect on it, praise the Lord for these spiritual blessings! You can use any of the verses provided for help, or find some on your own, as well as look up the definition of any word you would like more clarification on. For example; What does chose (eklego in Greek) mean What is the definition of predestined? Adoption as sons? Etc. Matt. 25:34; John 17:24; 2 Tim. 1:9; Col. 1:22; Eph.5:27; Rom. 8:15; Rom. 8:28-30; Job 14:5; Phil. 2:13; 2 Thess. 1:11-12; Isaiah 43:21.
