Lesson 5 Questions / Ephesians 1:15-23

Pray for the Holy Spirit to Guide you through this week's lesson. What role does prayer play in your daily life? Application Questions
How does the fact that Paul prays this way for his beloved challenge you to think
differently about the way you pray for yourself and others?

know God's power, rather than to receive more of God's power? Why does this matter? Use verses to support your answer (3)
