"Eternal Hope in a Terminal World" Il Corinthians 4:6-5:10

Our biblical focus for this final Sunday of 2017 is from the Apostle Paul's second letter to the church in Corinth. What is striking about this passage is how the eternal truths - certainties which are the basis of our living hope – are presented against the backdrop of the decaying, terminal world in which we live. Eleven times in these verses, Paul uses words or phrases which remind us of the transitory nature of life as we know it. As we examine them more closely, five distinct phrases emerge, and these will form the skeleton of our outline today. Our emphasis, however, will be on the eternal truths of hope which are linked to each word or phrase.
